Veterans Day 2011

"This nation will remain the land of the free only so long as it is the home of the brave." The eloquent words of Elmer Davis (news reporter, author and Director of the US Office of War Information during WWII) couldn't be more appropriate as we approach Veterans Day on November 11, 2011. Each year when the wreath is laid during the Veterans Day ceremony held at the Auburn Veterans Memorial, citizens are given the chance to pay on their debt of gratitude to those brave men and women who have fought and continue to fight for our freedom.

This Veterans Day, citizens are invited to honor our service men and women by attending a special wreath laying ceremony at 10:00 a.m. which will include performances by the Drake Middle School Mixed Choir directed by Allyson Petrone and musical selections performed by bagpiper Dan Drummond. Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. will officiate. Immediately following the ceremony, a reception will be held at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue.

Attendees are encouraged to park at Felton-Little Park and the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex. Parking for the disabled will be available on Ross Street, between Glenn Avenue and Harper Avenue, which will be closed to through traffic during the ceremony. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the City Council Chambers at 141 North Ross Street.

Surrounding the monument are brick pavers in honor of individual veterans with ties to members of our community. This year, 19 new bricks honoring individual Veterans will be installed in time for the Veteran's Day Ceremony. If you would like to honor a loved one who served, new bricks are available for immediate purchase to be installed in time for Veterans Day 2012. Safe Driving After Dark

As the sun begins to set earlier in the evenings this Fall, transportation safety becomes even more critical. According to the Alabama Department of Public Safety, approximately half of the fatal motor vehicle crashes in Alabama occur after dark.

Most of the contributing factors in night-time crashes are directly or indirectly involved with vision. Over-driving your headlights is a common and dangerous practice. You should never drive so fast that you cannot stop within the distance you can see ahead with your lights. Headlights on high beam normally illuminate the roadway about 350 feet under normal conditions. Dimming headlights when meeting or following traffic is required by law, as well as being a sensible driving practice. You must dim your headlights when within 500 feet of an oncoming vehicle and within 200 feet when following another vehicle.

In most instances, when you dim your headlights, the oncoming driver will do likewise. If, after you dim your lights, the other driver fails to act likewise, do not reengage your high beams. In addition to ensuring that all lights are operating properly, keep the lenses clean. Keep all glass on your vehicle free of defects and make sure your windows are clean.

According to state law, headlights (not parking lights only) must be turned on from a half-hour after sunset to a half-hour before sunrise and during other periods of limited visibility when you cannot see clearly for at least 500 feet. At night, be especially watchful for highway signs, pedestrians, bicycles, slow-moving vehicles and animals on the road. By practicing safe driving, you can help keep Auburn's roads and streets safe for everyone.



Toys for Tots Toy Drive Kicks Off

The Auburn Department of Public Safety may be well south of the North Pole, but that never stops the Auburn Police and Fire Divisions from an annual effort to collect toys for hundreds of Auburn families in need. The department kicked off the 2011 Toys for Tots drive on Tuesday, October 4.

Registration began at the Auburn Police Division at 161 North Ross Street on October 4. Anyone can register a child ages one through ten to receive a gift. Registration days will be each Tuesday and Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. with the last day to register being November 30. To be eligible a parent or legal guardian must provide a picture ID, the child's social security card or birth certificate, and two of the following three documents: current light bill; water bill; or lease/rental agreement.

Anyone wishing to donate to Toys for Tots can drop off a gift at any Auburn Fire station or the Auburn Police building at 141 Ross Street. Thanks to the generosity of Uncle Bob's Self-Storage, two remote drop off points have been established at stores located at 1231 Gatewood Drive and 2020 South College Street.

The gifts must be new but do not need to be wrapped. Helpers will place the gifts into age-appropriate categories before delivery which is scheduled during the week before Christmas. Citizens are encouraged to help make this holiday season a little brighter for families facing difficult times. All donations are greatly valued and no gift is too small.

Revised Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance Approved by Council

At its September 20, 2011 meeting the City Council acted to adopt a revised Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The revision was required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as a result of a six year project to update base flood elevations nationwide. The City of Auburn worked in conjunction with Lee County and FEMA on the initiative, which includes an updated flood insurance rate map and revised floodplain management measures. The effective date of the revised ordinance is October 27, 2011.

During the project, the City of Auburn Public Works Department made contact with property owners affected by the new floodplains. Affected property owners are encouraged to contact their insurance agent as soon as possible if they have not already done so to obtain or modify flood insurance as necessary. Property owners should be advised that the flood insurance application process starts with your local insurance agent, but must go through FEMA and could take as long as 30 days to process.

The Auburn Fire Division encourages citizens to use the end of Daylight Saving Time as a reminder to change the batteries in smoke detectors throughout your home. A working smoke detector should be placed on every level of your home, in the kitchen, and in every bedroom.

November Holiday Schedules

City Hall will be closed on Friday, November 11 in observance of Veterans Day and Thursday and Friday, November 24 and 25, in observance of Thanksgiving. Public Safety services, including Police, Fire, and Communications, will remain on their regular schedules during the holidays. Please avoid placing items on or near storm drains, mailboxes, utility poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly contained or banded so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. All carts and collection bins must be removed from the curb by 6 a.m. the following day.

Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling Event Saturday, November 12, 2011

The City of Auburn's Environmental Services Department - Recycling Division will host a FREE Secure Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling Day on Saturday, November 12, 2011 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce parking lot, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue. The event will be held in conjunction with America Recycles Day and in partnership with the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, East Alabama Shredding and Security, Waste Recycling, Inc., and CompuPoint USA LLC.

Citizens, businesses, and non-profits will be given the opportunity to properly dispose of outdated, unwanted or broken electronics and the opportunity to safely destroy documents in a secure manner. Businesses will be limited to four archive size boxes of documents for the shredding event. Shredding contractors will only be accepting electronics for recycling and paper documents for shredding. NO HAZARDOUS WASTE will be accepted. This is a rain or shine event. For more information, please contact Environmental Services at 501-3080.

Auburn residents may recycle their electronics year-round at the City of Auburn Environmental Services Department's main office, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Computer-related equipment and televisions smaller than 19" are accepted by appointment only. Televisions 19" and larger may be left at curbside for collection.
